of people with early onset dementia will not be included in this review The median life span after a diagnosis of dementia in Australia is unclear, however it was reported as 5-8 years in Britain⁴ Dementia was the third leading cause of death In Australia in 2010 accounting for 6% of all deaths, which was an increase 24 times that of 2001
